\*The day will conclude with an Easter Hat Parade starting after lunch followed by the famed Easter Egg Drop Test (Parents are welcome to come in support)

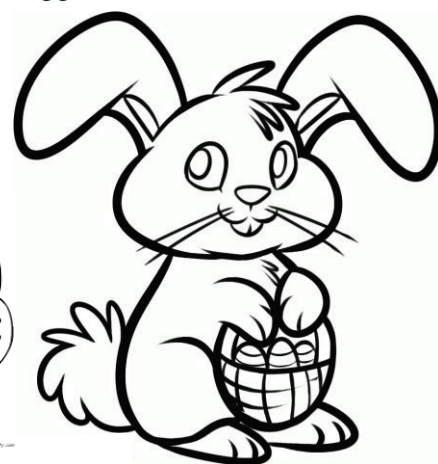
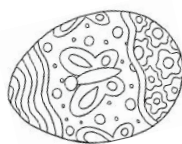
