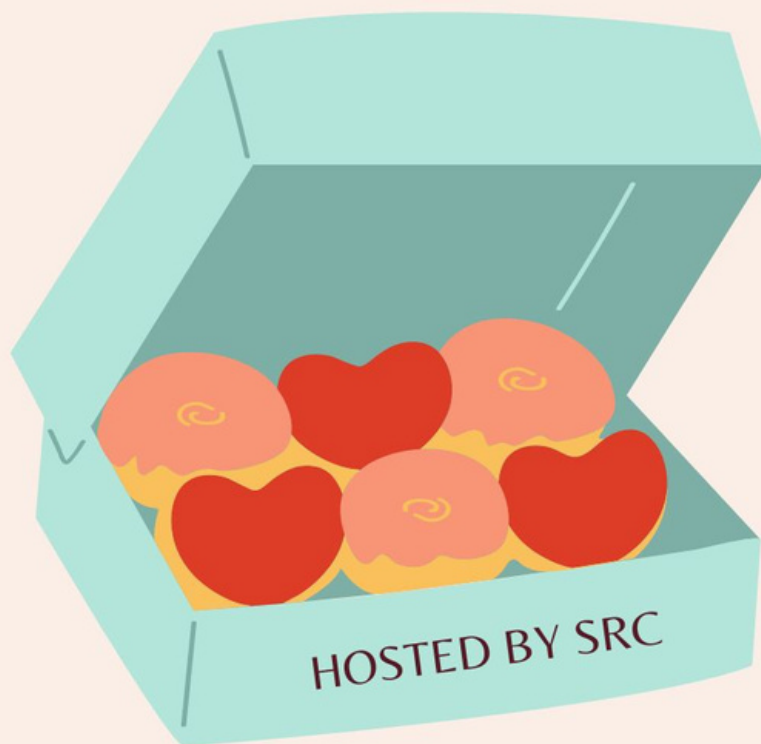
In NSW Government schools, applying to move from primary school to high school is a 2-step process:

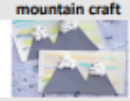

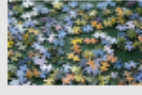
